Dear Patients,

The team at Unity Healthcare are delighted to share with you the news of our recent CQC inspection report, where the practice is now considered "Good" in all areas. This has been a long journey since being placed into special measures in 2019, and the result of a lot of hard work and innovation from the whole team.

We now have an established and stable team at the surgery, and are proud of the exceptional service that this talented and hard-working group deliver. Overall, we are currently providing more than 9000 consultations per month, which represents more than half of our entire practice population every single month.

It is a turbulent time to be working in (or being treated by!) the NHS. There are long hospital waiting lists, a struggling ambulance service, and an exhausted and demoralised workforce. The threat of widespread industrial action looms large, and the never-ending slew of anti-GP rhetoric in some segments of the media shows no sign of abating. I recently delivered a speech at the National Conference of Local Medical Committees about the harm that this negative political and media campaign is doing to the GP workforce, and as a consequence, to you, our patients. We continue to do our best in the face of adversity, and the team at Unity are thankful to those that offer us encouragement. We are grateful for the hard work that our amazing colleagues across the NHS are putting in, shift after shift, and are always doing everything we can to work together to look after you.

Invasive Group A streptococcal infections have been in the news, so we are understandably hearing of lots of concerns regarding feverish illness in children at the moment. As we are trying to prioritise the review of unwell children at this time, we do apologise if as a result you are waiting slightly longer than usual for us to respond to other enquiries.

We would like to congratulate Dr Adana Bodean who has been working under supervision at the surgery as part of the International GP Recruitment training scheme. She has now successfully been awarded full accreditation and will continue to work with us as a substantive GP.
